APPROVAL OF MAP 18836 FOR WATER APPROPRIATION A-19194

WATER DIVISION 1-F

BACKGROUND

1. On February 18, 2014, Tyler Binder filed in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) application A-19194 for a Permit to Appropriate Water.
2. On October 22, 2014, Tyler Binder filed in the Department map number 18836 showing land proposed to be irrigated under application A-19194.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Map number 18836 is APPROVED.
2. The following land is authorized to be irrigated (appurtenant land) under surface water appropriation A-19194 as depicted on map number 18836 which is made a part of this Order.

3. Appropriation A-19194 has a priority date of February 18, 2014, and authorizes the appropriator the use of water for irrigation of the 143.8 acres of land described above. The water may be diverted from Yankee Creek at points of diversion located on both banks of the stream in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 34, Township 5 North, Range 9 East of the 6th P.M. in Johnson County, as depicted on map number 18836. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated at a maximum combined rate of 2.05 cfs from all points of diversion (920 gallons per minute).

4. Water diverted shall not exceed the ratio of one cfs for every 70 acres irrigated nor the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry. Therefore, in any year when less than the maximum permitted acres are being irrigated, the quantity of water diverted at any time may be restricted to 1/70 cfs for each permitted acre being irrigated that year. This appropriation of water under any circumstance shall be limited annually to 3 acre-feet per acre of land on which water is actually and beneficially applied; not to exceed the least amount of water necessary for the production of crops in the exercise of good husbandry.
5. The appropriator is bound by all terms and conditions of the approval of application A-19194.
