APPROVAL OF APPLICATION A-18684

WATER DIVISION 2-F

Background

1. On December 16, 2009, J. Douglas Nelson, President, Green Island Farms Inc., filed application A-18684 in the Department of Natural Resources (Department) for a Permit to Appropriate Water.
2. On January 21, 2010, J. Douglas Nelson filed map number 17604 showing land proposed to be irrigated under application A-18684.

Order

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that application A-18684 is APPROVED subject to the following limitations and conditions:

1. The source of water is Antelope Creek.
2. The water shall be used for the purpose of irrigation.
3. The priority date is December 16, 2009.
4. Only the land shown on map number 17604 may be irrigated under appropriation A-18684.
5. The rate that water may be diverted under appropriation A-18684 shall not exceed one cubic foot per second (cfs) for every 70 acres irrigated. Total annual volume of water diverted may not exceed 3 acre-feet per acre irrigated.
6. The appropriator must comply with all relevant statutes. This includes, but is not limited to, the following:
  - a. Notify the Department of any change in ownership or address.
  - b. Notify the Department of the name and address of the person responsible for the use of the water appropriation (this may include farm managers, tenants, or relatives that actually apply the water to the approved use).
  - c. Getting approval from the Department prior to taking any action that changes the location of the point of diversion, the location of the place of use, the type of use, or the type of appropriation.

Deadlines

1. Construction of the diversion works must begin within twelve months of the signing date of this application approval. The appropriator must proceed diligently with the construction unless interrupted by some unavoidable and natural cause.
2. Construction of the project must be completed by two years past the signing date of this application approval.
3. The appropriation is not considered perfected until water has been beneficially applied for the purpose stated in this approval. September 1, 2012, is the date by which the water appropriated under A-18684 must have been used.
4. After September 1, 2012, a field investigation will be conducted to determine the amount of water used and acres irrigated, after which an order of cancellation will be issued for any unused portions of appropriation A-18684.

Additional Information


Failure to comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to surface water appropriations, any orders issued by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources, or the provisions of this Approval may result in the cancellation of the appropriation, temporary closing of the appropriation, administrative penalty, criminal prosecution, or any combination thereof.

Nebraska law provides that failure to use a portion or all of a perfected appropriation for more than five consecutive years may result in cancellation of the appropriation.

This appropriation is not a guarantee that water will be available. Nebraska law gives priority to senior appropriations. This appropriation may be closed if there is insufficient water to satisfy senior appropriations. If in the future you are not able to divert sufficient amounts of water, and if there are junior appropriations upstream, you may call for water by contacting your local field office.
