APPROVAL OF PETITION VAR-2147 FOR LEAVE TO FILE AN APPLICATION

FOR A TEMPORARY PERMIT TO APPROPRIATE WATER

WATER DIVISION 2-C

BACKGROUND

1. On June 29, 2011, the Department of Natural Resources (Department), through judicial action of June 16, 2011, issued a Revised Order of Final Determination to change the status of the Lower Niobrara River Basin from fully appropriated to not fully appropriated.
2. Pursuant to *Neb. Rev. Stat. 46-714(12)(b)*, if a status change occurs, any stays previously in force by the Department shall remain in force and the Department shall place an immediate stay on the issuance of any new natural-flow appropriations in the river basin or subbasin.
3. On August 8, 2011, Larry Hankin, on behalf of the Dawes County Roads Department (Petitioner), filed Petition VAR-2147 for Leave to File an Application for a Permit to Appropriate Water. The proposed application is for a temporary permit to appropriate less than 10 acre-feet of water for the purpose of public road construction from Antelope Creek at a point of diversion located in the NW¹/₄NW¹/₄ of Section 28, Township 31 North, Range 47 West of the 6th P.M. in Dawes County.
4. *Nebraska Revised Statutes § 46-714(3)(n)* allows for new surface water appropriations and increases in irrigated acres if the Department grants a variance and subsequently approves a permit for such new use.
5. When filing a variance request, a project proponent must offer a clearly stated basis for such request and must offer sufficient good cause shown. *Department of Natural Resources Rules for Surface Water, Title 457 Neb. Admin. Code Chapter 23* lists six circumstances that may be put forward as justification for granting a variance to apply for a new water use, in conjunction with an examination of good cause shown.

FINDINGS

1. The Order dated June 29, 2011, resulted in a change of status from fully appropriated to not fully appropriated and the stay on issuing new surface water appropriations was continued.
2. The maintenance of roads constitutes a public safety issue.
3. The proposed application is for a temporary permit to appropriate less than 10 acre-feet of water for public road construction. The Petitioner asserts that water use is a necessary component of the construction project which addresses a public safety issue.

CONCLUSIONS

1. The proposed application is for a temporary permit for less than 10 acre-feet of water.
2. The proposed project addresses a public safety issue and the Petitioner has shown good cause, thereby meeting the requirements of *Department Rules for Surface Water 457 Neb. Admin. Code Chapter 23*.
3. Petition VAR-2147 should be granted.


ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. Petition VAR-2147 for Leave to File an Application for a Permit to Appropriate Water is GRANTED.
2. The granting of petition VAR-2147 shall not bind the Director to approve any application to which it relates, or in any way be used as evidence of prejudice for the Director's future decisions concerning the specific approval requirements of such application. Allowance of leave to file an application does not negate the necessity to meet the specific approval requirements for an appropriation.
